

BKSA Instructor Revalidation Course fact sheet

As a BKSA instructor it is a requirement to revalidate your qualification every three years

As a standards agency, it is the BKSA's responsibility to ensure quality training is being delivered at all levels and as a member organisation we are here to support the ongoing development of instructors no matter when they did their ITC. To this end all instructors are required to attend a revalidation conference every 3 years from the point of their original ITC.

The purpose of these courses is to update your information as teaching practices move on, in line with the new equipment being developed by manufacturers and best practices that are evolved over time as well as changes to legislation and regulations that have been adopted by local authorities and government that may have an impact on kite surf training both nationally and internationally.

Conferences are generally held twice annually in varying locations and this will be one in the spring and autumn of each year with one in the North and one in the South. The conference itself will be quite informal using a workshop style and will be led by a BKSA national trainer or examiner.

Upon completion of the revalidation, instructors will be provided with a new instructor certification, which will be valid for another three years.

Failure to revalidate your qualification will result in your qualification becoming invalid, which may result in invalidating your insurance.

Conference cost **£80**

Requirements:

You must bring:

- Original Instructor certificate
- RYA PB L2 certificate
- Valid First aid certificate
- Valid BKSA membership card

NB If you miss an instructor conference, you can revalidate individually by contacting a BKSA trainer examiner. This will incur a higher cost.
